Dear Parents and Carers

We've made it! This Autumn Term has been the longest I have ever known in my career! The children and staff have worked so hard since September and it is now time for a well deserved break!

It has been so lovely this past couple of weeks to see school, children and families come together at the various events. It has also been a good opportunity to reflect on the latest part of the schools' journeys and how far we have come since September.

This term has seen a new CurriCulum implemented in all year groups in both schools. This has been no mean feat and I would like to say a huge thank you to the staff for their tireless work in planning and delivering this CurriCulum. The Children have really enjoyed their learning and are beginning to be able to speak with increased confidence and understanding about their "sticky knowledge". We recently had a Local Authority monitoring visit who validated this and were really encouraged by what they saw and heard.

The children have enjoyed visits from the Science Bus, swimming lessons (for Luttons children, Sherburn will begin theirs after February half term) and tag rugby and football fixtures between the two schools. It was so wonderful to see all the children and staff from both schools at the pantomime recently, and we will be planning more trips in the coming months.

We are sad to say goodbye to various staff members at the end of this term. At Sherburn, we say goodbye to Miss McGough and Miss Taylor and at Luttons we say goodbye to Mr Moorwood and Mrs Walker. I would like to thank them all again for their contributions to school life and for supporting the Children and families that they work with. I am sure you will join me in wishing them well in their new adventures.

In January, we will be extending a warm welcoming Miss Emma Trotter to Luttons as Class 1 teacher and Senior Teacher. Miss Childs will take up the role of Senior Teacher at Sherburn.

I would like to thank all parents and Carers for your ongoing support across both schools. School improvement takes time and is never a quick process, but we should all be very proud of the positive changes that have happened so far, and especially during this past term.

I wish you all a very happy Christmas and look forward to seeing you all in 2024.



PE Days and Kits

On PE days (Wednesday and Fridays) Children will come to school in their PE kit and remain in their PE kits all day.

PE kit is a white t-shirt, black shorts and plimsolls or trainers for outside. As the weather gets colder, Children Can wear their school sweatshirts over their t-shirt—NO hoodies, or branded clothing. Just the school sweatshirt or a school fleece.

Forest School Days

On Forest School day (Thursday) children are to come to school in their uniform but ensuring that they have their arms and legs covered. As we move into Autumn and Winter, this shouldn't be a problem as the boys will be wearing trousers and jumpers and the girls wearing trousers or tights. Children may bring an extra sweatshirt/fleece to add as an extra layer when it is cold. They will also need a weather appropriate coat.

No jewellery is to be worn on PE, Forest School or swimming days. If children are able to take out and put back in earrings on their own they may do so. If they are not able to, they should not wear earrings to school on these days. Taping over earrings is not permitted.
