PE Days and Kits

On PE days (Wednesday and Fridays) children will come to school in their PE kits all day.

PE kit is a white t-shirt, black shorts and plimsolls or trainers for outside. As the weather gets colder, children can wear their school sweatshirts over their t-shirt—NO hoodies, or branded clothing. Just the school sweatshirt or a school fleece.

Forest School Days

On Forest School day (Thursday) children are to come to school in their uniform but ensuring that they have their arms and legs covered. As we move into Autumn and Winter, this shouldn't be a problem as the boys will be wearing trousers and jumpers and the girls wearing trousers or tights. Children may bring an extra sweatshirt/fleece to add as an extra layer when it is cold. They will also need a weather appropriate coat.

No jewellery is to be worn on PE, Forest School or swimming days. If children are able to take out and put back in earrings on their own they may do so. If they are not able to, they should not wear earrings to school on these days. Taping over earrings is not permitted.

This week in EYFS we have spent time ordering numbers 1-5 in many different ways. We have made real flying comets in forest school and practice d balancing our bodies during PE.









Our Learning This Week.....Class 1

This week in class 1 has a been a busy one!

We chose objects to put into a time capsule in our history lessons and explored how birthdays have been celebrated over the years.

In PSHE we have been talking about relationships and what makes a good friend, we have also learned about different learning disabilities and how people can sometimes act or respond in a way that we might not expect.

In Maths, we have been focusing on addition - the Year 2 children would benefit from counting in 10s and starting from different numbers to see if they can spot a pattern. The year 1 children have been looking at number bonds and would benefit from some practise with number bonds to 10. Don't forget that you can access sumdog at home for additional practise. Check the back of your child's reading record for username and password.

In PSHE the children have focused on how to keep themselves safe. They have come up with some fantastic discussions and debates.

In English class 2 have become poets, they have created their very own firework poems and I can't wait to see the finishing touches.


Class 2 had a blast at the tag rugby tournament, showing fantastic teamwork skills and determination.
