We have had science week this week and we have been investigating materials and their properties. We have set up a recycling centre in our classroom and organized our rubbish.








Our Learning This Week.....Class 2

Our Learning This Week.....Class 3

In computing this week we have used Code Spark academy to create sequences, loops and debugging errors.

In Geography we created our own rivers using sand, tin foil and pebbles. Focusing on meandering and ensuring the rivers had a mouth into the sea.

In PE we had a symnastics competition where the judges were looking at their approach, shape and landing. The children were also scored on the difficulty of their planned sequences.
